




The drivers of habitat loss need to be tackled urgently through action in all areas - especially in the way land is managed for agriculture.










University Mammal Challenge (UMAC)



What is it?

UMAC is an annual competition run by the Mammal Society.

Why get involved?

1 in 4 of Britain's mammals are at risk of extinction. University and College campus's can be hotspots for mammal species. UMAC helps monitor mammals in areas that often don't get surveyed.

How it works:

Teams select 4 transects to walk every month, recording mammals/mammal signs on the mammal mapper app. Team can also survey using footprint tunnels, camera traps or acoustic equipment. Or earn points by hosting engagement events or fundraisers for the Mammal Society.
